This noun only occurs 6x in the NT and "cave" is always adequate. The word "den" is usually associated with animals. Uses #4, \$5,6,

are all literal and are real actual caves. Uses #1, #2, #3 are all figurative of the temple and are all references to,

9 "Will ye steal, murder, and commit adultery, and swear falsely, and 'burn incense unto Ba'-al, and bwalk after other gods whom ye know not;

10 "And come and stand before me in this house, bwhich is called by my name, and say, We are delivered to do all these abominations?

11 Is a this house, which is called by my name, become a bden of robbers in your eyes? Behold, even I have seen it, saith the Lord.

This word "den" is translated "den" - 2x, "hole" - 1x, and "cave" - 36x.
