Consider the uses of this noun together with the verbs apiQuéw (arithmeo) - "to-number", and καταριθμέσμαι (καtarithmeomai)-"to-number-down". Our word arithmetic comes from this word. The translation of these words in the KJ is very consistent. Once the uses of these words are seen in a group, altogether, some verses become more clear.

The first 7 uses shown here are quite easy to understand. In Rom. 9:27 the noun is shown in a figurative sense, to indicate an extremely large number. This sense occurs again in Rev. 20:8, page 2.

In Rev. 7:4 it is a large number but still easy to understand, 144,000. In Rev. 9:16 the noun is used twice. Note the plural armies, NOT army as in KJ. (2 × 10,000 × 10,000) = 200,000,000 armies. How many soldiers" in one army? In Rev. 13:17,18 we have 4 uses of the noun. The exact number is given as 666. There is much quess work as to the meaning of this number. Not all manuscripts agree. At present there is no solution. A fifth use of this noun in this connection in Rev. 15. The verb apiquew (arithmeo) only occurs 3x. Twice, with reference to God's numbering every

hair on the heads of his chosen people, the Israelis. Rev. 7:9, indicates an ever increasing crowd, "the (ones) coming out-of the tribula tion, namely the great (one), (Rev. 7: 14). A fixed crowd, no matter how great, could be numbered. No one could number a constantly increasing crowd. (See Apologetics 8)

ACTS 1 CT

Acts 1:17 (<u>Katapi Guéouai</u>) occurs only in reference to Judas. Note the CT, (a perf. pass. part.) See Apologetics 2.
