The adjective <u>IT VEUMATIKÓS</u> (pneumatikos), spiritual comes from this verb. (see the control word itself; <u>ITVEUMATIKÓS</u> (pneumatikos) under a separate listing, together with the adverb <u>ITVEUMATIKÃS</u> (pneumatikōs), "Spiritually.") Here, under this verb, we will also consider the noun <u>ITVOÚ</u> (pnoee), breath. The noun <u>ITVEÛMA</u> (pneuma), "Spirit" occurs over 380 times. We will show only 4 of those here. (The word "ghost" in the older KJ; used for "spirit", has been corrected in the newer printing.)
