is greatly confused in the KJ. See the "control words": Euxonai (euchomai), "to-wish; προσεύχομαι (proseuchomai), "to-pray"; EpwTaw (erotao), "tointerrogate; Mapakalew (parakaled), "to-entreat." I see no real reason for confusing these verbs. By examining the passages under this "controlword"it can be seen that the meaning of this verb and noun does not have to be varied. The Greek word can be translated consistently, whether or not we have a perfect understanding of its exact meaning. Notice the KJ, 4 meanings used: "prayer, supplication, request, heseech."

In Acts 1:14 Sénois (de-eesis) does not occur in ABCDEX manuscripts.

"Petition" is usually a prayer for a specific need (See Séw - deō (B) 4-5)

Webster: "petition implies a formal request---in accordance with established rights." The first use of the noun is a good example; as is Rom.10:1
