In Messiah Yeshua, we have graduated from the Sinai Covenant's Law School.

Galatians 3:25 But the trust having-come we-are no-more under (a) disciplinarian-tutor.

At this time, I understand/experience Sukkot as God's sheltering Presence in Jesus Christ:

- 1 Corinthians 3:9 For we-are fellow-workers of God; (a) farm of-God, YOU-are (a) building of-God.
- 1 Corinthians 3:16 "Are YOU not knowing absolutely that YOU are the sanctuary [ναὸς naos] of the God, and the spirit of God is dwelling [οἰκεῖ οἰκεὶ] in YOU?"
- **John 1:1** "The Word was in (the) beginning, and the Word was with the God, and the Word was God."
- **John 1:14** "And the Word came-to-be flesh, and he-tabernacled among us, and we-beheld his glory, glory as of-(an) only-begotten from (the) Father full of-favor and truth."
- **Psalm 61:4** I will dwell in thy tabernacle for ever: I will take refuge in the covert of thy wings. Selah
- **Psalm 91:4** He shall cover you with his feathers, and under his wings shall you trust: his truth shall be your shield and buckler.
- **Psalm 36:7** How precious is thy lovingkindness, O God! And the children of men take refuge under the shadow of thy wings
- **Psalm 57:1** Be merciful unto me, O God, be merciful unto me; For my soul taketh refuge in thee: Yea, in the shadow of thy wings will I take refuge, Until these calamities be overpast. **Psalm 63:7** Because you have been my help, therefore in the shadow of your wings will I rejoice.
